

Champion Schools' Upgrades & Improvements for School Year 2010-11

New roof has been installed on CES & paid for through a HB 264 energy savings loan-which guarantees that the energy savings will pay for the loan obligation. The CES roof was in critical condition warranting replacement. The HB 264 loan provided an energy savings method to replace the roof and pay for the replacement.

Asphalt repair/ patch work to be completed @ all school buildings @ a cost of \$ 8,875.00. Project to be paid for through the permanent improvement and general fund monies

Heating and ventilations system repairs as needed in all buildings.

Handrail system to be installed on CMS bleachers, making the bleachers safer for people to use during sporting events – cost \$3576.00 to be paid through the permanent improvement fund

Sidewalk repairs to CES and CHS to alleviate safety concerns.

Installation of a new boiler @ CMS funded through HB 264 loan. The boiler is more than 30 years old and needs to be replaced. Energy savings are guaranteed to pay for the loan amount which is approximately \$ 330,000 for the new boiler.

Construction of a storage facility @ the sport complex to be used for district mowers, athletic equipment and sports field maintenance equipment. Cost of the materials for the 24' x 52' building to be \$ 13,000.00. The storage facility will be constructed by district personnel and paid for through the permanent improvement fund.

New student classroom desk units for 3 CMS classrooms @ a cost of approx. \$ 10,000 paid through the permanent improvement and general fund.

Window blinds replaced in 3 CHS classrooms @ a cost for \$ 5,520.00 to be paid for through the permanent improvement fund.

New reading books and reading materials for students in grades 5-8 at an anticipated cost of \$ 37,000.00 to be paid for through the general fund.
